Full Arch Immediate Restoration in Challenging Situations

Alan Meltzer DMD, MScD

Today, the use of full arch restoration is entering the realm of mainstream treatment. Some believe that removal of teeth and their restorations is the conclusion of a patient's dental problems. Some even feel that by giving a patient an oral irrigator they are set for life with no need for professional maintenance. With 30 plus years of implant dentistry behind me, I have learned that in some cases four implants may be enough, while in other cases it is a formula for disaster. A fixed restoration on four implants can easily become no fixed restoration on three implants. Case selection, case design, implant selection, abutment selection along with proper soft and hard tissue evaluation and treatment become the keys for success. Finally designing a proper maintenance program is mandatory. Let us not trade our patients' dental problems for implant problems and create unrealistic expectations.


